I'd dance until the sun came up. Sweat until our clothes were dripping and never stop. The women were hot and loved GIs. I was in heaven. Walking down the street I'd have 10 or 20 people around me because I spoke Thai. It was like being a king or celebrity. This I made note of because I knew that when I got home I'd never have that feeling again. When I left Thailand I sat on the plane with tears streaming down my cheeks. I didn't want to die but I told myself, if I do die on this flight I've lived more in the last 12 months than I'll ever do for the rest of my life. So far, I'm right.

Comments: We brought a squadron of F-105's from Yokota to Korat on August 5, 1964. As I recall, there was only 16 personnel there when we arrived. Our hooch area was renamed "Camp Nasty" as we only had one outhouse, a mess hall under construction, a few hooches and one bath area. There was no hot water, 10-12 showers, but only 2-3 with shower heads. There were no sinks and ceramic wash pans had to be used. Our first TDY lasted 40+ days, then Yokota began a 35 day rotation period. We would spend 35 days at Korat, 35 days back to Yokota, 35 days to Osan, 35 days back to Yokota and continued what seemed forever. I was a Doppler Systems Technician in the Avionics Squadron.

My name is Jim O'Neal and I was a Tech Sergeant at that time. I spent approximately 14 years with the F-105 at Seymour Johnson, Itazuke, Japan, Yokota, Japan, TDY's to Korat and Takhli, McConnell AFB, Kansas, back to Takhli for a 12 month tour, then back to McConnell. I also taught the F-105 Doppler System at the FTD unit at McConnell.

The F-105 was a superb aircraft and the men and women who worked on them and flew them were outstanding. I have lost contact with most of these people over the years, but would love to hear from anyone.
