Comments: Wrote on this board about 6 years ago. I was at Korat 10/70 to 10/71. Lead team loading F4's. Walt Smith, Charlie Todd, Joe Chapman. I new TINY DOYLE I believe he lives somewhere here in Anaheim. We use to play football against the 105 crews. I would love to hear from anyone from that period. I was a 3 man. I remember when a pilot was down how we were allowed to frag without all of the rules and it pumped us up. Worst day - I talked everyone on our shift to sitdown on the flightline. We were pissed because of the lack of support from the homefront, my wife couldn't get a credit card, formost was on strike so we had milk problems etc, and now the reasons sound stupid, but we were young. They called us in and broke our crew up after being together for 6 months. But we got back together at Davis Monthan for our last year before discharge. Another time one of our crews dropped a missle, I think it was an Aim 9, bent the fins so badly they through it in the klong. We all kept that a secret until now, sorry Sgt Ward. I remember the mars station and sitting for hours to talk for a few minutes. Made one direct phone call that cost \$13 for a minute. Recorded alot of music still have my sony 651 and 730 reel to reels with over 600 albums recorded during my time in the AF. Its hard to believe its been 40 years. I miss the guys I served with, only a few John Winnett, Frank Whitman, Gene Baroana, Terry Anderson, Gail Geisick, and Walt Smith I still have limited contact with. Recall painting the bombs at xmas time, getting hit by the frickin rice bugs, watching the Thai guards eat them right there on the flightline. One time after returning from a mission a pilot tossed his helmet to the ground from the cockpit because he was angry. He had located a Sam site and could not get clearance to destroy it. MOnths later B52's were falling from the sky as those same Sams fired away. It really sucked. Our crew went TDY to Phan Rang to learn how to dearm all of the planes there. It seems some of them would end up at our base after flying missions in Laos and Vietnam border. I'll shut up now, but I sure would like to talk to the guys I met over there.

Comments: Stationed at Korat from April 68 through Mar 69. Col Paul Douglas and then Col McDonald were the wing commanders of the 388th TFW. Lt. Col Guy Sherrill was the 44th TFS

Commander (Wild Weasels); Col. Felix "Doc" Blanchard was Deputy DCO followed by Lt. Col Billy Ellis. Blanchard was Col. Smith's Deputy and Ellis was Col William Craig's deputy. The 469th TFS converted from Thud's to the first E model Phantoms in SEA in OCT 68, and that was the beginning of quite a rivalry between the fighter jocks. As the sentry at Apache Village on duty one evening a group of eight phantom crews were leaving Apache Village to be transported out to the ramp for their night missions. One major stopped to ask me what it was that I liked so much about those Thuds as they only carried six bombs and a couple missiles and had a single engine. His bird, the Phantom could carry twenty four bombs, four missiles and had two engines. I responded, " begging the Major's pardon sir, it only takes the Thud jocks six bombs to get the job done!" Two pilots from the 34th TFS were standing behind us when I gave that response and they howled their approval. It wasn't too much after that, that I, an enlisted man, got to go up on a test hop in Captain Jack Redmond's Thud (same day as the Bob Hope Christmas show in Dec 68). We broke Mach, pulled five negative G's and I continue to believe that to be one of the greatest days in my life. Lot's and lots of great memories. Two incredible pilots that befriended me were lost tragically, Capt. Koontz, of the 469th ferrying a Thud back from Clark AFB, was diverted to Da Nang with engine trouble and his drag chute never deployed. He had already finished his 100 missions and was getting ready to go back to the "world" in time for Christmas. Shortly after that horrible tragedy, Major Buado, also of the 469th, but flying a Phantom, augered in shortly after taking off on a dawn mission and crashed due to vertigo. I would love to hear from any of the warriors that I proudly served with during my tour.
