AF to train women pilots

Air Force officials have announced plans to begin a limited test program to use women as pilots. Details are still being wolked out, but the first group of women could start training in the summer of 1976. The first students would be selected from women officers already on active duty.

Security Police get more stripes

Officials have announced that 100 added promotions will be given security police (811XO) during the next promotion cycle to staff sergeant (January-May 76). They say this is a further effort to correct supervisory shortages in the career field. This raises the 811XO E-5 promotion opportunity to about 50 per cent. Additionally, the 50 per cent increase in promotion opportunity for E-8/9 security police that was begun during the fiscal 1976 promotion cycle will be continued during the fiscal year 1977 cycle.

Beginning of the end at Korat 34th TFS departs

As the decade of United States presence in Thailand comes to an end, so does the history of the 34th Tactical Fighter Squadron come to a close here. A true fighting unit with a proud history, the 34th has taken part in every armed conflict in the Pacific theater for the past 10 years.

Flying the F-105 Thunderchief, the F-4 Phantom, both E and D models, the members of the 34th have had roles verying from basic air-to-ground weapons delivery to wild weasle operations. Included in the squadron accollades are six downed MIGs in air-to-air combat and over 100,000 combat hours logged in each type aircraft. Much fo the 34th's combat time was flown over the heavily defended Hanoi and Haiphong area of North Vietnam,.

As the 34th prepares to go on to a new location, at present unknown, the mission will remain to fly and fight whenever called upon and to constantly place ordnance precisely on target wherever and whatever that target may be.

16th SOS packs up

The 16th Special Operations Squadron, owner of the "Fabulous Four-Engine Fighter," leaves Korat with mixed emotions. The 16th, better known as "Spectre," departs with an unmatched record of mission accomplishment. The annals of Southeast Asia Air Force history show the dedication, effectiveness, and spirit of it's men.

Spectre maintained the ability to direct and provide firepower offensively and defensive-

Spectre maintained the ability to direct and provide firepower offensively and defensively anytime, anyplace and anywhere it is called for. The 16th has shown the U.S. Air Force and the world that it can do it's job well.

Spectre fought through many years of strife and conflict in Southeast Asia. Thousands of burning trucks, stacks of flaming supplies and exploding piles of munitions lit the skies and exploding the conflict in Southeast Asia. Thousands of burning trucks, stacks of flaming supplies and exploding piles of munitions lit the skies and testified to Spectre's role as a hunter.

The AC-130 Hercules gunship is the offspring of the AC-47 Spooky, AC-119 Shadow and Stinger gunships. Spectre, the largest and most advanced gunship, first flew into combat from Nha Trang AB, Vietnam in September 1967. In 1968 the gunships moved to Ton Son Nhut AB, Vietnam and then to Ubon, Thailand, where Spectre resided and flew from for most of the war. Withinthree years, the 16th SOS had destroyed more than 5,000 trucks. Spectre finally moved to Korat in 1974, its last home in Southeast Asia.

The gunships of the 16th have numerous operational capabilities and can perform many functions. Close air support, armed reconnaissance, reconnaissance, convoy escort, night base defense, forward air control, and search and rescue are among its many missions. Spectre's "eyes" or sensors can see things thousands of feet below her. The AC-130 is unique and has no peer in the Air Force inventory!



Get those alien passports, visas

As all of us are aware, Korat will be closed shortly. During their tours here, a considerable number of military personnel have acquired alien spouses and children born abroad.

The Consular Section of the American Embassy is attempting to do everything possible to expeditiously handle the vast increase in visa cases, in reports of births and in passport and citizenship matters for spouses and children of members of the U.S. Armed Forces. BUT THEY NEED YOUR ASSISTANCE AND **COOPERATION!**

They have received approval for temporary help, both from the military and from the Department State. They have already doubled their visa workload and shall continue to process at least twice as many visas (and passports and reports of birth) as done under normal times. Double the number is the maximum however!

They are absolutely unable to give "instant appointments" or "appointments out of turn." The only exceptions to this ruling are: (1) instances where a spouse is reaching seven months' pregnancy and per doctor's certification must travel at once; (2) in cases where the spouse is a Vietnamese, Cambodian or Laotian national and must depart Thailand by a given date; (3) in instances where there may be a death or terminal

lness (as documented by a phyician in the U.S.) on the part of n immediate relative of the merican citizen spouse or (4). n cases where urgent and major nedical treatment is needed (as ocumented by a physician in Thaiand) on the part of the alien pouse.

In all cases where an exception requested under one of the bove categories, in addition to he medical evidence in certain in-stances, each such request must be accompanied by an official re-quest from the base personal afairs officer-in-charge.

Appropriate military authoities have informed the Consular Section that dependents acquired abroad can follow to join the memer of the Armed Forces on spacevailable military carrier. This will do much to alleviate any fiancial hardship on the part of the

rmed Forces member.

The presence in Thailand of he member of the Armed Forces in connection with travel documentation of alien spouses and children born abroad is needed only for (1) filing the petition to accord the alien spouse, and in some instances, alien children, "Immediate relative status." Once the petitions have been filed and approved, the petitioner can depart the country with reasonable assurance that the family member (s) will follow to join not too long thereafter, 2. filing and ensuring

proper completion of all required forms for the Report of Birth of an American Citizen Aroad, Once the Report of Birth has been approved the alien spouse can han-dle the application for an Ame-rican passport and the Armed forces member need to remain in Thailand until the passport is issued.

Following an the basic steps in the processing of an immigrant visa for an alien spouse and/or children born abroad who cannot be documented as American citizens:

1. Complete the petition form (s) and ensure that all required supporting documents are attached, including the fe

2. Submit (or have the Base Personal Affairs Offic submit) the petition(s) to the Consular Embassy, Section, American Bangkok, for approval BE SURE AYOU HAVE INCLUDED THE PRO-**ADDRESS** PER MAILING FOR THE BENEFICIARY ASTHIS IS THE ADDRESS WHICH WILL BE USED BY THE CONSULAR SEC-TION IN ALL FUTURE CORRES-PONDENCE WITH THE BENEFI-CIARY (IES). If the Base Personal Affairs will continue assistance, the Address may be used as the mailing address.

3. Instruct the beneficiary(ies) that on receipt of instructions as to the documents needed, the form, DSP-70 must be completed and

returned at once. When all documents are obtained, the checklist must be signed and returned.

4. Once the Consular Section has completed the clearances done on the basis of the DSP-70 and has received the checklist, Packet #4 will be sent to the beneficiary(ies) giving an appointment date and including medical examination forms and visa application forms which must be completed and brought in with other documents on the day of the appoint-

5. If everything is in order, the visa(s) will be issued the same day as the appointment.

Remember that the Consular Section cannot respond to telephone inquiries asking the status of visa cases, requesting appointments by telephone, etc. All steps in visa cases will be handled by correspondence hereafter. At the present time, there is an approximately six week waiting period for an appointment after the checklist is submitted. This waiting list may extend up to two months or more depending on the number of members of the Armed Forces who acquire families in Thailand and whose tours of duty are curtailed with the pending base closure. A word to the wise is usually sufficient, but in this case mandatory. submit that paperwork for passports and visas NOW. TIME IS **GROWING SHORT!!!**

The base Accounting and Finance Office is tentatively scheduled to become an agent of U-Tapao RTNB on Feb. 1. What this means is that the pay service Korat provides will be through U-Tapao support.

Any document Korat receives which cannot be processed in time to affect the end of January payday

will have to be processed by U-Tapao. This situation establishes the requirement that they have a cut-off for accepting memberinitiated documents such as allotment starts, stops, changes and check mailing address changes. Only actions that will alleviate financial hardship will be accepted after Jan. 10.

Therefore, finance officials

strongly urge that you ask yourself if all of your monetary matters are straightened out now and, if not, to take immediate action to insure the financial stability of yourself and your family. Don't get caught short or let your family suffer because you procrastinated.

If you are not sure what actions need to be taken, go see the

friendly folks at the Military Pay Section of Accounting and Finance. They can help you, advise you and start the necessary documents to put your financial plans in action. But don't wait until the last minute. You know there will be a long line of last-minute "shoppers" on Jan. 10. Use your head and get your pay straight NOW!



Let's start with the menu, topped off by FREE sirloin strip steaks, hot dogs, soft drinks, fruits and other assorted goodies too numerous to mention.



The Military Airlift Command (MAC) Passenger Service Section at Don Muang RTAFB has announced that space available travel to the continental United States, Hickam AFB, Hawaii, and Andersen AFB Guam will not be be available after Dec. 18. The last MAC contract flight will operate on this date from Don Muang.

Space available travel from Don Muang will be almost non existent, they added, and will be limited to the unscheduled medevac flight to Clark AB, P.I.

Passenger Service at Don Muang advises those desiring space available travel from there make alternate arrangements.


KORAT SHOWTIME

RAFFERTY AND THE GOLD DUST TWINS, starring Alan Arkin and Sally Kellerman, is a tale of an ex-Marine (Alan Arkin) giving a ride to two girls he has met in the park-The Gold Dust Twins (Mackensie Phillips and Sally Kellerman) and being forced to drive to New Orleans at gunpoint. When he resists, one of the girls fires her gun and he is convinced. Upset at first, Arkin gradually warms up to the two and offers to take them to Las Vegas. The film follows the three odd-balls on a cross-country odyssey across the American southwest enroute to New Orleans. RAFFERTY AND THE GOLD DUST TWINS is a movie filled with small, unexpected pleasures. An off-beat comic misadventure "road movie."

BOXCAR BERTHA, starring Barbara Hershey, David Carradine, Barry Primus, Bernie Casey and John Carradine is a film set in the depression 30's. Barbara Hershey teams with Barry Primus when she shoots a man to save him, then they meet David Carradine and Bernie Casey and turn their attention to robbing trains. In an attempt to kidnap John Carradine, Primus is killed and David and Casey caught. Years later, Barbara and David take up together again. Aside from the sexual aspect, violence, language,



partial nudity and overtones of racism may offend some.

THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN RIDE is an epic cowboy flick about lawman Lee Van Cleef on the trail of Darrell Larson, a young punk whom he freed at the urging of his wife, Mariette Hartley. Larson later robs a bank, seriously wounds Van Cleef and kidnaps Miss Hartley with his companions. The revengeful Van Cleef has five convicts paroled and along with Michael Callan "THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN RIDE" into adventure. In a climatic shootout with a gang of

bandits, they defend a town filled with women led by Stefanie Powers. There is a great deal of violence and bloodshed in this action-packed Western.

When three British agents are murdered, the head of British Secret Service assigns the case to "Bond" who jets to New York and narrowly escapes an ambush. Bond tails his adversary Kananga (Yaphet Kotto) and his tarot-Solitaire (Jane reading seer, Seymour), into Harlem. In a far reaching search, filled with every conceivable device for mayhem. Bond, with his usual aplomb, locates Kananga and preceeds to blow him to bits. This is Bond at his best, pure unadulterated entertainment with action in every scene.
